

What is the Qur'an?

The Qur'an is the last book sent by the Lord of the worlds. Muslims believe in all the Books sent before the Qur'an, i.e., the Scriptures of Abraham, the Psalms, the Torah, the Gospel, etc. Muslims believe that the true message conveyed by all the Books was pure monotheism, i.e., having belief in Allah and worshiping Him alone. It is available among all Muslims and is memorized by many of them. The current translations of the Qur'an in various languages, which are widely spread among people, are nothing but the mere translation of the meanings of the Qur'an. The Lord of the worlds has challenged the Arabs and non-Arabs to bring the like of this Qur'an, knowing that the Arabs at that time were the masters of eloquence, rhetoric, and poetry; however, they were certain that this Qur'an could come from none but Allah. This has been a standing challenge for over fourteen centuries, and none has been able to rise to it, and this is one of the greatest proofs that it is from Allah.
